The annual congress hosted by the Critical Care Society of Southern Africa Congress (CCSSA) and SASPEN was hosted with great excitement as an "in-person event" on 12–15 October 2023 at the Boardwalk Convention Centre in Gqeberha / Port Elizabeth. The congress featured local and international speakers with vast expertise in the field of clinical nutrition. Delegates had the opportunity to attend the ESPEN LLL (Life-Long Learning) workshops on different topics and the program included exiting pre-congress workshops.

The SASPEN recognition awards was presented at the CCSSA Congress for contributions in the field of clinical nutrition:

- The Award for best oral presentation at the 2023 congress was awarded to Janicke Visser for her work on "Barriers and enablers to address adult hospital malnutrition: a (South) African perspective".
- The Arina Prins Award for best original research publication in an international journal was awarded to Zarina Ebrahim for her publication "The effect of b-glucan prebiotic on kidney function, uremic toxins and gut microbiome in Stage 3 to 5 chronic kidney disease (CKD) predialysis participants: a randomized controlled trial".

- The Award for the best publication for clinical nutrition in a national journal was awarded to Ilde-Marie Kellerman for her publication "Agreement between measured energy expenditure and predictive equations in paediatric oncology".
- The Award for the best publication for clinical nutrition: - review article was awarded to Ermi Spies for her publication on "Nutrition and vasoactive substances in the critically ill patient".
- The SASPEN President's award was awarded to a leader in the field of clinical nutrition both locally and internationally. The award was presented to Prof. Demetre Labadarios, Professor Emeritus Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, Stellenbosch University for his exceptional contribution to the field of clinical nutrition.
