## **Nutrition workshop**

The Eastern Branch of the Nutrition Society of South Africa (NSSA) was represented by Prof Carin Napier, NSSA council member, at a workshop that was hosted by the Department of Health (the national and KwaZulu-Natal provincial office) on 9 November 2015 at the South African Sugar Association in Mount Edgecombe. The national strategy for obesity prevention and the control of obesity in South Africa for 2015-2020, and the process used in its development, was presented by Mrs Lynn Moeng-Mahlangu, Department of Health at the workshop. Dr Leegail Adonis presented on best practice and highimpact strategies for the prevention and management of obesity, and provided an overview of programmes implemented in other countries in the fight against obesity. Ms Lenore Spies shared initiatives presented by the KwaZulu-Natal provincial office. Participants were asked to identify gaps in the national and provincial strategy during the second part of the workshop and to rate and rank the activities to be conducted under each goal of the strategy according to the order of priority. Information collated during the workshop will assist in the implementation of the activities under each goal.

## **Mini-symposium on antioxidants**

The Cape Branch of the NSSA hosted a mini-symposium relating to antioxidants on 18 February 2016, at the South African Medical Research Council premises. The event was attended by 35 delegates, including NSSA members, the Association for Dietetics in South Africa (ADSA) members and students. Invited speakers were Prof Wentzel Gelderblom, who presented *Antioxidants: an infinite battle of insults and responses*, Prof Lizette Joubert, who spoke on Antioxidant activity of plant extracts – time for a reality check, Prof Jeanine Marnewick, whose paper was entitled, *Rooibos: the human perspective*, Prof Simeon Davies, who presented on Aconcagua: rooibos and high altitude performance, and Dr Harris Steinman, who spoke on Ethics and morals encompassing supplements.
