


# SASPEN - Q3

Our highlight was the annual SASPEN congress, hosted in collaboration with the Critical Care Society of Southern Africa (CCSSA) in Durban from 14-17 August 2025. This year's theme, "From Shoreline to Lifeline: Anchoring Critical Care Excellence", set the stage for a dynamic programme featuring international keynote speaker Professor Arthur van Zanten alongside leading local faculty.

The congress was preceded by a series of pre-congress workshops- including practical sessions on nutritional assessment and Surgical implications on GIT anatomy.
